Venue Information

The 2023 Annual Forum will be held in two physical venues in Abu Dhabi, UAE, as well as online. FORM will host Welcome Drinks on the evening of the 22^{nd} of October on The Lawn of Al Saadiyat Rotana Resorts & Villas.

The scientific programme will begin at Al Saadiyat Rotana Resorts & Villas on the morning of the 23^{rd} of October. We will then provide transport to Khalifa University on the afternoon of the 23^{rd} to all delegates joining us for the remaining sessions of the day in the Main Lecture Auditorium.

The sessions hosted on the 24th of October will all be held at Al Saadiyat Rotana Resorts & Villas. However, as a hybrid event, delegates can also join the sessions online (see page 42).

Finally, all panels held on the 25th of October will be hosted completely online, and no physical viewing venue will be provided by FORM. You will be able to access all panels via the Zoom links shared with you via your email, or by scanning the QR code available on page 42, and log on using your device.

Registration

Formal registration will begin the evening of the 22^{nd} from 6:00-8:00pm and will also be held on the morning of the 23^{rd} from 8:00-8:45am. However, delegates will be able to register and collect their conference packs throughout the event.

There will be a registration desk placed at the lobby entrance and main entrance of the ballroom area of the hotel conference venue.

If you arrive late to the hotel venue on the 23rd and miss the bus transfer to Khalifa University, you will need to register and collect your badge from the Khalifa University registration desk, directly outside of the auditorium.

Transport Between Venues

FORM will be organizing appropriate transport for all delegates and speakers joining us at both Al Saadiyat Rotana Resorts & Villas and Khalifa University. Buses will collect delegates and speakers after Lunch on the 23rd of October (around 1:30pm), and drop them off at Khalifa University.

Following the completion of the Khalifa University programme, the buses will then collect delegates and speakers and return them to the hotel venue, where they can return to their rooms, catch the shuttle back to the Beach Rotana Hotel, or drive home.

Al Saadiyat Rotana Resorts & Villas

Location

The 2023 Annual Forum will host its parallel sessions in the Emerald Meeting Room and the Almas Ballroom at Al Saadiyat Rotana Resorts & Villas on the 23^{rd} and 24^{th} of October.

If you are staying at the hotel, you will be able to access the conference venue through the lobby on the Ground Floor (to the right of the main hotel entrance). There will be signage within the hotel to guide you to the Annual Forum.

If you are driving to the conference, you can access the conference venue directly through the ballroom parking, to the right of the hotel driveway (signage available to follow outside). The hotel offers both Valet parking options, as well as self-parking in the parking lot directly outside of the Almas ballroom hall.





Amenities & Facilities

The hotel has designated prayer rooms within the conference area and are clearly marked near the Lobby entrance of the venue.

Khalifa University

Location

The conference will be partially held at Khalifa University on the afternoon of the 23rd of October, in the Main Lecture Auditorium in Building E. While it is possible to drive to Khalifa University, please note that parking is extremely limited and as a result, we highly recommend that you leave your car parked at the Al Saadiyat Rotana Resorts & Villas, and join us on the buses we will be providing to move all delegates and speakers over to the University campus.

If you must drive, please refer to our campus map on page 27, and make sure to account for the potential wait time of 30+ minutes to find a parking spot when planning your journey.

Once inside, there will be signage and a support team that will be able to guide you to the relevant lecture auditorium for the remainder of the sessions.

Dress Code

Please note that Khalifa University has a strict dress code policy that must be adhered to by all those affiliated with our event, including delegates, speakers, VIPs, and organisers. Emirati attendees must dress in traditional clothing (Abayas for women and Kandoras for men).

The following points must be observed regarding visitors' dress at the University campus:

Male Visitors Dress Code

- Male visitors must wear a shirt and long trousers/jeans. Shorts and sleeveless shirts must be avoided.
- Clothes displaying offensive/objectionable writings/drawings/pictures must be avoided.
- · Visible tattoos and piercings must be avoided.

Female Visitors Dress Code

- Female visitors must dress conservatively wearing long-sleeved shirts/ blouses with long and loose fitting skirts/slacks, or a long-sleeve loose fitting long dress.
- Shorts, short skirts and sleeveless/low-cut neckline shirts must be avoided.
- Clothing that is tight, transparent, or short and shows too much skin or exposes the waist, back, or legs must be avoided.
- Clothes displaying offensive/objectionable writings/drawings/pictures must be avoided
- Visible tattoos and piercings must be avoided. This does not include generally acceptable items such as earrings and henna.
