Travel & Transport

Travel to and from Sharjah

Sharjah is very closely connected to Dubai through the Dubai-Sharjah-Ajman metropolitan area, with commuter traffic creating rush hour traffic jams. Many people live in Sharjah but work in Dubai, hence traffic from Sharjah to Dubai and Dubai to Sharjah is largely expected in rush hours.

The emirate is considerably larger than Dubai, with coastline on both west and east coasts of the peninsula, and with exclaves of Kalba, Khor Fakkan, and Dibba Al Hisn. The road to the east coast goes through rugged Al Hajar mountains. Public buildings in the Emirate are all in Umayyad and Abbasid architecture.

Major Airports:

There are a number of airports conveniently situated for travel to Sharjah. Airfares vary depending on the airport chosen, so do check all options to ensure you get the most appropriate option.

- Dubai International Airport (DXB), is a 20-25 minute drive away from the American University of Sharjah, and a large number of international airlines operate here.
- Sharjah International Airport (SHJ) is a 10-15 minute drive away from the American University of Sharjah, and various carriers including Air Arabia operate from here with a good regional network.
- Abu Dhabi airport (AUH), is a 90 minute drive away from the American University of Sharjah.

Getting around UAE

Taxis are available at most locations and accept cash and card payments. However, for convenience following apps can be used:

- Careem and Uber. Available in all emirates and offers regular taxis and more comfortable options. Payments via card or apple pay.
- Bolt. An alternative to Careem, can use to book taxi or more comfortable rides online. Only operating in Dubai.



Weather in the UAE

In October the temperature is usually around 36 degrees centigrade during the day, dropping to around 25 degrees centigrade in the evening. Please be aware that humidity levels are often high during this period, especially in the coastal areas. However, many venues have strong air conditioning, so do ensure you p-ack suitable clothing to remain comfortable.

Dress Code in the UAE

Please note that the dress code for the Annual Forum is: Business casual.

The UAE has a relatively modern and tolerant approach to dress codes, but it's still important to respect the local culture and traditions. In malls, markets, and public spaces, modest clothing is appreciated. Recommended clothing includes:=

- Men: T-shirts, shorts, and light pants are fine. Avoid tank tops and overly short shorts in more conservative areas.
- Women: Loose, breathable clothing is ideal. T-shirts, blouses, and knee-length skirts or pants are common. Shoulders and knees should generally be covered in public, especially in less touristy areas.

Sharia Law and What to Be Mindful of

Although it's possible in some Emirates like Dubai to buy and drink alcohol in selected hotels, restaurants and bars, Sharjah remains an alcohol-free Emirate. It means that sale and possession of alcohol is almost entirely forbidden.







This workshop will connect the Forum for Open Research MENA to two international AI programs, the Open Source AI Definition (OSAID) and the Association of Research Libraries (ARL)/Coalition for Networked Information (CNI) AI Scenarios: AI Influenced Futures.

The OSAID is part of the global exchange regarding open source AI, which has profound importance, particularly given its role in the European Union's AI Act, and attempts by private sector companies such as Meta to use its own definition as a global default. The Open Source Initiative (OSI) led a community co-design process to develop version 1.0 of OSAID, and seeks to build upon this initial definition with feedback from the global community.

The ARL/CNI AI provides a critical asset for research libraries and organizations aiming to strategically plan for the transformative power of artificial intelligence. The ARL/CNI Joint Task Force on Scenario Planning for AI/ML Futures led a consultative process with the ARL and CNI communities to develop their report, which includes scenarios, strategic context report, and a provocateur interview report. ARL/CNI are in the process of developing a toolkit based on these reports, which would offer a roadmap and plan for implementation. One of the co-presenters (Webster) is leading this effort, with workshops already planned for the US and Canada. This proposed roundtable or workshop would be the first in the MENA region.

As Open Science gains momentum across the MENA region, research integrity is emerging as a structural component in the design and operationalization of national and institutional research strategies. This workshop will provide a critical policy and regulatory analysis of how research integrity can be systematically embedded into broader Open Science agendas — not as a parallel concern, but as a foundational principle enabling transparent, equitable, and trustworthy research ecosystems. Framed by comparative policy studies, international benchmarks, and empirical insights from the Open Science Monitoring Initiative, the session will dissect the regulatory instruments, governance models, and institutional mechanisms that facilitate the alignment of integrity norms with Open Science implementation. Emphasis will be placed on policy interoperability, enforcement modalities, and the role of monitoring and evaluation frameworks in driving sustained reform across diverse national contexts.

Participants will subsequently be able to (r)evaluate their respective policy environments, share case-based insights, and contribute to the articulation of regionally relevant, integrity-first Open Science models that reflect local legal frameworks, resource distributions, and epistemic cultures.

Prior to this, he was the dean of a university college at Al-Balqa Applied University in Jordan, and has also held visiting professor positions at Johannes Gutenberg University in Germany and the University of Mississippi, USA, supported by a Fulbright scholarship. He has received several prestigious awards, including the Distinguished Academic Award from the Arab Fund for Social and Economic Development in Kuwait. Widely published, accruing over 2,000 citations and an h-index of 23, Prof. Dr. Mohamad Sanad Abu-Darwish serves on the editorial boards of multiple scientific journals and is a member of various national and international scientific organizations, including serving as the founder and chair of the Society of the Medical Heritage in Jordan.

Nahed Salem is the Project Manager of the Arab Research and Innovation Co-funded Alliances (ARICA), led by the Federation of Arab Scientific Research Councils (FASRC). With extensive experience in the field of science, technology, and innovation (STI), she specializes in the design and analysis of STI indicators, survey development, and both quantitative and qualitative analysis. She previously managed the joint project "Mobilizing the Egyptian Innovation System for SMEs' Innovation Capabilities," funded by the German Ministry of Education and Research. Her work also includes monitoring and evaluating the performance of universities and research institutions, as well as contributing to Egypt's community innovation survey covering 4,000 SMEs. He served as a consultant to the Arab Council for the Social Sciences (ACSS) in Beirut, where he translated training materials on Research Data Management (RDM) in the social sciences from English into Arabic, and successfully completed a Training of Trainers (ToT) course offered by the Council. He is the founder and General Coordinator of the Arab Community of Open Access (ACOA) and the Regional Open Science Alliance (ROSA) in the Arab Region.

Alicia Wise is Executive Director of CLOCKSS, a crucial open infrastructure service. This international digital archive ensures the long-term preservation of the scholarly record and is collaboratively governed by libraries and publishers around the world. Content deposited in the archive is stored in 12 secure vaults around the world. If the original publisher ever stops providing access, the CLOCKSS archive restores access under an open license. Alicia has been active in increasing access to research information in diverse roles within the academic, funding, library and publishing communities.

Initiated by UNESCO in 1950, the IAU has been a vital global institution for higher education and research. Her work with



the Expert Group involves developing recommendations and sharing best practices to guide universities in their transition toward Open Science. She focuses on changing cultural norms to enable the adoption of open research practices, tools, and values, while addressing power dynamics and inequalities in knowledge production. Batool believes that Open Science is fundamentally about decolonisation — challenging the legacy of settler colonialism that has marginalised Indigenous knowledge systems and promoting their integration into global research practices.
